

Lisa's Rajput Necklace and Bracelet Set

Necklace Ingredients

5g RC110 SL Red AB size 8 seed beads (A)
1 x MB157 silver hook fastener
8 x MB085 5x3mm rope and pip washer beads (B)
1 x MB539 hollow spotted cushion bead (C)
11 x MB087 6x3mm spring edge washer beads (D)
2 x FN068 6x3mm oval jump rings
1 x FN016 silver headpin
50cm tigertail
2 x French crimps

Bracelet Ingredients

3g RC110 SL Red AB size 8 seed beads (A)
1 x MB157 silver hook fastener
4 x MB085 5x3mm rope and pip washer beads (B)
1 x MB109 large rope and pip washer bead (C)
8 x MB087 6x3mm spring edge washer beads (D)
4 x FN068 6x3mm oval jump rings (E)
30cm tigertail
2 x French crimps



To Make the Bracelet

Finish one end of the tigertail with a French crimp, making a neat loop that will later be used to attach the fastener.

Thread on 3A, 1D, 6A, 1B, 3A, 1D, 6A, 1B, 3A, 1D, 6A, 1D, 1C. This is the centre front, reverse the sequence from the last 1D added to complete the sequence and then finish of the other end of the tigertail.

To attach the fastener with two oval jump rings on each side of the clasp.

To Make the Necklace

The finished length of the pictured necklace is 42cm/16.5 inches, if you would like your necklace to be longer or shorter the easiest way to alter the length is to use more or less seed beads (A) in the sequences - just remember if you alter the count on one side of the necklace to make a note of it on the pattern so you do the same on the other side. This may sound like 'stating the obvious' but the beader who has never forgotten to keep track and never ended up going back to re-thread a piece is a very rare creature indeed!

Finish one end of the tigertail with a French crimp, making a neat loop that will later be used to attach the fastener.

Thread on 30A, 1B, 3A, 1B, 10A, 1B, 3A, 1B, 10A, 1D, 3A, 1D, 10A, 1D, 3A, 1D, 10A, 1D. This is the centre front of the necklace.

To make the pendant thread 1A, 1D, 1A, 1C, 1A onto the headpin, trim and loop.

Thread the pendant onto the tigertail and complete the necklace by reversing the threading sequence listed for the first side and finish with a French crimp.

Finally attach the clasp to complete, using oval jump rings.
