We sat down with a 100g packet of our Patchwork Cube Mix and one pot of seed beads. This is what we made - it surprised us too: the beads just seemed to go on and on and on.

this Little Boxes Bracelet is made with right-angle weave

The techniques are all very simple - straight stringing, an easy right-angle weave, ladder stitch, St Petersburg chain and square stitch. If you have not tried bead weaving before this is a good place to start.

Frost Patchwork Mix MX177

a simple stringing technique for this Rainbow Bracelet

You Will Need

100g of Frost Patchwork Cubes (MX177)
One 18g pot of RC708 black size 10/0 seed beads
Eight larger (6-8mm) beads for the clasps
A reel of black Nymo thread
OR

100g of Shiny Patchwork Cubes (MX178)
One 18g pot of RC011 silver lined crystal size 10/0 seed beads
Eight larger (6-8mm) beads for the clasps
A reel of white Nymo thread
AND
A size 10 beading needle
