


Snow On Snow Bracelet by Ellen

Made in odd-count peyote stitch this pretty bracelet fastens with a beaded tab.

To Make a 20cm (8") Bracelet

- 5g of DB0925 sparkle charcoal lined crystal Delica beads A
- 1.2g of DB0078 lined aqua mist Delica beads B
- 4g of DB202 white pearl AB Delica beads C
- A reel of white Nymo beading thread
- A size 10 beading needle



Understanding the Main Graph

The main graph shows the pattern repeat you will need. The start row of 11 beads is shown near the top of the main repeat. The pink line towards the bottom of the graph indicates the second repeat of the start row - when you get here move back up to the start row and work through the pattern sequence again.

Making the Bracelet

Prepare the needle with 2m of single thread and tie a keeper bead 50cm from the end. Thread on the beads 1-11 as indicated on the graph for the start row. Work down through the pattern using standard odd-count peyote technique until the band is 3cm short of the final finished length you require.

Refer to the Slot Graph which shows the shaping you need to make as you complete the next snowflake of the sequence. Work one more snowflake following the same basic pattern repeat as before making the shaping adjustment to the edges of the band as shown on the last rows of the motif in the Slot Graph and completing the slot as shown. Make sure the beadwork around the slot is firm and finish off the thread end neatly and securely.

Return to the keeper bead at the start of the work, remove it and attach the needle to this end of thread. Work up to the top of the grid forming the tab end of the bracelet. Do not finish off the thread end.

Pass the needle back through the beads of the tab to emerge from the edge of the work through the A bead marked with an ✱ on the left hand side of the main graph. An additional spur of 7A needs to be added here (and on the opposite side of the tab) to make the fastening secure.

Thread on 1A and pass through the next C bead back down the edge (fig 1).

Thread on 1A and pass back through the B bead just added (fig 2) to start the spur. Repeat to add a further five single A beads in even count Peyote (fig 3).

Make sure the beadwork of the spur is firm and properly attached to the main tab. Repeat to make a second spur to the opposite side of the tab and finish off this and all remaining thread ends neatly and securely.
